

2009 What Didn't Pass: Juvenile Justice

Bill: HB726
Sponsors: Ross (D38); Moore (R111); Goodwin (D66)
Title: CLARIFY EXPUNCTIONS
Summary: An Act to Provide that a Person's Record May be Expunged for a First Misdemeanor Offense Committed When the Person Was Less Than Eighteen Years Old Even Though the Person is Eighteen Years Old or Older at the Time of Conviction; to Provide that a Person's Record May be Expunged for a First Misdemeanor Possession of Alcohol Offense Committed When the Person Was Less Than Twenty-One Years Old Even Though the Person is Twenty-One Years or Older at the Time of the Conviction; to Require State and National Criminal Record Checks When Expunging Records; and to Provide that Any Person or Entity Required to Obtain a Criminal Record Check Would not be Deemed to Have Knowledge of Offenses Expunged Under the Statute.

Title: JUVENILE RECORDS/PROBATION RISK ASSESSMENT
Summary: An Act To: (1) Allow Probation Officers in the Division of Community Corrections Access to the Juvenile Records of Persons Subject to Probation Under Their Supervision for the Purpose of Assessing Risk Related to Supervision; and (2) Add the Division of Community Corrections to a List of Agencies Authorized to Share Certain Information Concerning Juveniles with One Another.

Title: REFORM BILL OF 2009
Summary: An Act to Restructure the Prior Record Level Point Ranges in Structured Sentencing in Order to Expand the Points in Prior Record Level I and to Even Out the Remaining Ranges; to Make the Increase in Sentence Lengths Between Prior Record Levels More Proportionate Using a Set Percentage Increment; to Increase the Period of Post-Release Supervision from Nine Months to Twelve Months, to Reclassify Statutory Rape or Sexual Offense of a Person Who is Fifteen Years Old by a Defendant Who is More Than Four Years but Less Than Six Years Older as a Class F Felony; to Provide for the Expunction of Convictions for Certain Criminal Offenses; to Modify the Age Requirements of Certain Expunctions to be the Age at the Time of the Offense Rather Than the Age at the Time of Conviction; to Make Conforming Changes to Existing Expunction Statutes; and to Require State and National Criminal Record Checks When Expunging Records.

Title: THE YOUTH ACCOUNTABILITY ACT
Summary: An Act to Define Delinquent Juvenile as a Juvenile Who is Between Six Years of Age and Eighteen Years of Age Who Commits a Crime or Infraction and to Establish a Task Force for Implementation of the Youth Accountability Act.

Title: EXPUNGE NONVIOLENT CRIMES
Summary: An Act to Provide for the Expunction of Convictions for Certain Nonviolent Criminal Offenses Upon Application and a Fee, to Allow Disclosure of Expunged Information to Law Enforcement Agencies and Other Specified Agencies for Employment and Licensing Purposes and to Require Those Agencies to Maintain the Confidentiality of the Expunged Information, and to Make Conforming Changes to Existing Expunction Statutes.
