

# How Healthy Are Stanly Children?



#### A woman's health

and well-being before pregnancy sets the stage for her baby's future health outcomes.



### 1 in 24 births in Stanly

County (4.1%) is to a woman who received very late or no prenatal care, putting both mother and baby at higher risk for pregnancy complications or poor birth outcomes.

# Low birth weight has

been found to be the strongest predictor of infant mortality.

1 in 10 Stanly babies is born at a low birth weight.



22.5% of Stanly children live in poverty. Poverty is linked to greater risk for health challenges like:





**Health insurance** coverage helps children achieve and maintain their best health

1 in 15 Stanly children (6.7%) is

uninsured, 841 of whom may be income eligible for Medicaid or NC Health Choice.



A baby born today in Stanly County would live 4.7 less years than a baby born in the county with the highest life expectancy.

## We can improve child health



Expand Medicaid to cover adults below 138 percent of the federal poverty line.

Support interventions to reduce infant mortality, like the CFTF Healthy Babies Bundle.

#### **Quick Facts**

60,529 people live in Stanly County. 1 in 5 residents (13,537) is a child under the age of 18.

The child population is 13.4% African American, 0.2% American Indian, 3% Asian, 9.6% Latino and 76.2% non-Hispanic White.

The median household income is \$42,518.

3,450 children in Stanly (25.5%) live in food insecure households.
