Quick Facts

Children's uninsurance rates in Clay County have declined by 24.5% since 2011 due to expanded access to coverage provided by Medicaid, NC Health Choice, and the Affordable Care Act.

There are 11,036 residents in Clay County, including 837 children ages birth to eight.

Clay's child population is 2.5% African American, 0.4% Asian or Pacific Islander, 0.3% Native American or Alaska Native, 7.7% Hispanic or Latinx, and 89.1% White.¹
